Volunteers Needed

Nature observers: As the summer progresses, please let us know what species you are seeing here: prairie flowers, butterflies, dragonflies, birds, mammals, frogs, and snakes. We'll post lists for other visitors to see.

Mowers: Can you help mow the grass this summer? We have a riding lawn mower and will train you. This time of year mowing is needed almost every week. We hope to have several volunteers who trade off. Call Judy to offer your help.

Cardboard recyclers: We need corrugated cardboard to put on the paths in the kids' gardens to help keep the weeds down. If you have cardboard without a shiny surface, please remove tape and staples and bring it to the nature center any day we are open.
