Prescribed Burn

April 16 <u>and</u> 23, 10 am program on controlled burns

April 16 <u>or</u> 23, 10:30 am, Conditions permitting, DNR specialists will burn 40 acres of our prairie. Come and watch!

DNR staff are preparing to conduct a prescribed burn on some of the grasslands. Specific weather conditions are required in order for the burn to be conducted, including wind speed and direction, temperature, and relative humidity.

The purposes are to maintain and improve the grassland habitats for a variety of wildlife species and to encourage growth of native prairie plants. Prescribed burns also reduce non-native invasive plants.

Our last burn took place in 2010.

Confirmation of EAB

Several years ago, emerald ash borer damage was first detected a few miles from Havenwoods. We knew there was a high probability that the invasive insects had attacked the ash trees here, too. The damage just wasn't advanced enough for us to see before. Now it is.

Cutting down the trees will be a staged process. Dead trees that pose a hazard will be removed this spring. We will continue to monitor the trees in landscaped areas and along trails. They will be cut down and removed over the next few years as they show more signs of damage and before they become a threat to safety. You can help staff by letting us know where you see ash trees that are dead and that could become hazardous.
